This half day seminar will introduce the **philosophical and scientific theoretical basics of Classical Chinese Medicine in its original form**.

Topics include:

- the difference between TCM and Classical Chinese Medicine and why TCM was developed
- causal – analytical philosophy and science in relation to conditional philosophy and science
 - Wu Wei, Dao, Wu Xing (Five phases)
- classical Chinese texts before and after the changes in Chinese writing
 - derivation of function – cycles in principle
- application of Wu Xing to diagnosis and treatment
